Self-plagiarism. This, I think, is especially relevant in relation to authors who publish articles based on already published technical reports. [Torsten Kolind]

Finding reviewers [Bryon Adinoff]

Non-participatory but professionally prominent members of the editorial board [Bryon Adinoff]

Coercive indexed self-citations (reviewers or editors asking authors to include specific citations) [Kerstin Stenius]

Fake reviewers (which has led to contraction of over 60 articles) [Kerstin Stenius]

Pubpeer - that is peer review after publication) [Kerstin Stenius]

Embargo on research by governments [Kerstin Stenius]
